Vocabulary Instruction


- **elude** (verb)
 - If you **elude** someone, you avoid them or escape from them.
 - The runaway slaves **eluded** the patrollers who were hunting them.
 - The convict **eluded** the police for 10 years.
 - When playing hide and seek, Jose **eluded** all of the other players.

Vocabulary Instruction

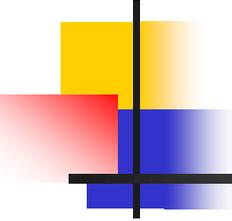
- **intention** (noun)
 - When you have an idea or plan of what you are going to do, you have an intention.
 - Harriet Tubman's **intention** was to become a free slave.
 - Harriet's **intention** was to escape slavery even if she had to go alone.

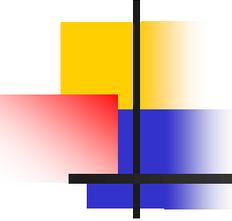

Vocabulary Instruction

- reluctant
 - If you are **reluctant** to do something, you do not really want to do it.
 - Some slaves were **reluctant** to escape because it was dangerous.
 - Harriet was not **reluctant** to escape.



If a slave wanted to **elude** patrollers, the slave might:

- d. Act like a slave by working in the fields.

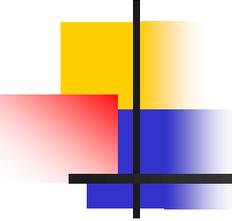

If a slave was **reluctant** to escape, the slave might:


- a. Never have an intention to escape.

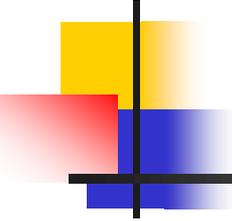
- If a slave had an intention to be free, the slave might:



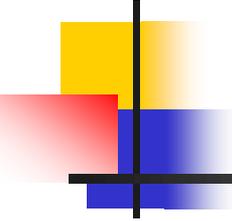
